HAPPY NEW YEAR...WITH ANY LUCK!

Who would have thought that at the beginning of 2022 COVID would still be very much in our midst, with the number of deaths topping 150,000 at the beginning of this month? However, rates do seem to have fallen now in London & there is hope that this latest Omicron wave could be on its way out.

So in a spirit of optimism, we are forging ahead with our plans for a full social calendar in 2022, buoyed up by the success of our Bonfire Night celebrations on Nov 6, 2021. After the hiatus forced on us by the COVID lockdown in 2020 hundreds of residents were able to enjoy Formosa's traditional bonfire & firework display, followed by a second – almost equally splendid – show in nearby Crescent Garden.



THOSE 2022 DIARY DATES IN FULL

First up on **Saturday June 4** will be a repeat of the highly successful **wine-tasting** which marked Formosa's official emergence from lockdown in June last year. The date is actually in the middle of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend for anyone who's looking for an extra excuse to raise a glass.

Next in the diary is the **London Gardens Weekend**, scheduled to be back in physical form for the first time since 2019. As a long-time participant we plan to open Formosa to the public from 2—5 pm on **Sunday June 12**. Of course we all know the glories of our garden but likely to be of particularly interest to serious horticulturists is the fact that under the 50-year master plan agreed with Westminster Council in 2016 we are gradually replacing some of the more aged & damaged plane trees with new trees, including a couple of groves of silver birch. Incidentally under our biennial programme there is to be another round of pollarding this year, probably in late February or early March, although permission from Westminster is still being sought.

Then on **Friday July 1** we are due to welcome back the touring company **Shakespeare in the Squares** – again for the first time since 2019 – with a production of **Shakespeare's The Tempest**.

On **Saturday July 9** we plan to re-instate our hugely popular **Summer Party** — full details to follow in the April Newsletter. The **Formosa AGM** will also take place at some point in **July** — & this year the **Bonfire & Fireworks** eve will unusually fall on the day itself, Saturday **November 5!**

All this however subject to – dread words – the state of play regarding Covid.

FLOOD DISASTER: THAMES WATER IN THE DOCK

It's just over six months since the catastrophic events of July 12 last year when a month's worth of rain fell on London inside three hours & many - -tho' by no means all — of the basement flats that were flooded have had their repairs completed, but the post mortem as to why it was allowed to happen is still v much on-going.

Thames Water, which is responsible for the capital's drainage system, has commissioned an independent review which it's hoped will present its findings at a public session

Thames Water's director of Corporate Affairs George Mayhew has apologised for the company's "unacceptable" response to people whose homes were ruined & agreed that it had been implementing what he called "band aids" for years instead of finding a permanent
