Many of you will remember the runaway success enjoyed by the small theatre company Shakespeare in the Squares last July with their staging in the Garden of The Tempest, normally viewed as one of the Bard's darker plays but this time with the comedy skilfully accentuated & some rather good (if not period-appropriate) songs shoe-horned in. The good news is that the company are back again for an extended season this year with a production of Twelfth Night, more obviously suited to the bucolic surroundings of the various gardens! The (slightly) bad news though is that we will not be hosting it this time as it's the turn of our neighbours, the Crescent Garden (we've alternated with them over recent years), where the performance will take place on Tuesday 4th July. So that gives Crescent first dibs at the tickets which go on sale on 11th April, but with any luck there will still be plenty left to go round.

...hence the name, Family Fun Day, which this year is being staged from **12 noon to 6 pm on Saturday 8th July**. Attractions will include Magic Mikey, the renowned kids' magician & entertainer. There will also be face-painting & inflatables for the younger children & a food vendor, plus the ever-reliable ice cream man Raffaele Raimondo, now heading into his 36th year at this event.

But please note – although there will be plentiful supplies of food it is strictly bring your own booze this year!

FIREWORK NIGHT TO BE BIGGER & BETTER THAN EVER!

This year we are changing suppliers for the event on Saturday 4th November (at no extra cost to the Garden it should be said!). We've decided to go with Firework Crazy, a multi-award-winning company with over 35 years' experience of staging professional displays throughout the South-East. They were the winners of last year's Firework Champions event at Hatfield House & did the after-show party at this year's Brit awards in February -- so we can confidently expect the results to be more spectacular than ever! The show will be timed at **7 pm** to precede the two simultaneous shows either side of the Garden in Crescent & Winston Amenity at 7.30 pm. The aim is to make the bonfire a bit more long-lasting wind & rain permitting! -- & there may also be some changes to the usual lay-out, but these will be confirmed closer to the date.





GARDEN NEWS

After the lights on the big plane tree sadly failed last Winter, we will shortly be installing some new, branch-wrapped, lighting for special occasions such as Bonfire Night & Christmas, plus

floodlights in the crown of the tree to provide some gentle illumination in the Garden during the long dull winter months.



At the time of writing the daffodils around the plane tree are in full flower but when these die away we hope that the meadow seed will bring more colour to the area.

Meanwhile the plane trees on the periphery of the Garden had their biennial haircut in February, courtesy of our death- (or at least injury-) defying tree surgeons. As has become the custom they



used a tree chipper to grind down the smaller branches so they could be put on the flower beds as mulch, which helps to improve the health & fertility of the soil.

When Barbara Milne, Head of Arboricultural Services at Westminster City Council, came to see the progress of the Garden Master plan ahead of giving us permission for the pollarding she was most interested in our diseased trees (mentioned in the Winter NL), which are now marked with green tabs. Her team came up with the Leopard moth (zeuzera pyrina) as a likely culprit for the damage (<u>https://butterfly-</u> conservation.org/moths/leopard-moth)
